Andrew Peregrine obtained his DVM and PhD from the University of Glasgow in Scotland. He then worked for nine years as a research scientist at the International Laboratory for Research on Animal Diseases in Nairobi, Kenya, where he carried out research to improve control of tropical parasites in cattle. Since 1997, he has been teaching at the Ontario Veterinary College as an Associate Professor in clinical parasitology. In addition, his current research interests include emerging zoonotic parasite infections in companion animals, and drug resistance in sheep parasites. He is a diplomate of the European Veterinary Parasitology College and the American College of Veterinary Microbiologists.
